# PROCEDURE

## student exchange program

### BEFOREHAND:

Identify the faculties open to students according to the exchange agreement between our universities: <https://uga.adv-pub.moveonfr.com/home-page-1591/>

If you have a UGA exchange agreement, identify the host faculty using the disciplines taught by faculty in the course catalog.

EXCEPTIONS: In order to exchange students with : Medicine, the CUEF, and UGA's three autonomous educational institutions, Sciences Po Grenoble, Institut Polytechnique de Grenoble and Ecole Nationale Supérieure d'Architecture de Grenoble, you need to set up a specific student exchange agreement.

## 2 APPLICATION PROCESS

1 FROM MARCH 15 TO MAY 30

2 FROM SEPTEMBER 15 TO OCTOBER 18

Nominated students will automatically receive an application email upon their nomination.

**The required documents are:**

- All academic transcript of records
- Curriculum vitae
- Any language test or a certificate of language. **Please check that the language level required by the host faculty is respected either in French and/or English.**
- Student's motivations
- Learning Agreement UGA (or ERASMUS+ provided by the home university) completed in accordance with the rules defined by the host faculty.

The home university determines the number of credits that can be taken, up to a maximum of **30 credits** per semester.

## 3 APPLICATION FOR HOUSING

Accepted students will receive an e-mail, with login details to access the online accommodation platform.

The deadlines will be specified when the housing procedure will be sent.

## 4 REGISTRATION TO FRENCH COURSES

## ESTIMATED COST OF LIVING

<b>Food</b>	200€-300€/month 3,25€ - 4,75€/meal at university restaurant
<b>Phone / Internet</b>	from 2€ to 30€/month
<b>Transportation</b>	<b>Grenoble:</b> <25 years old: 15€/month. Bike rental: 15€-25€/month (+ deposit). <b>Valence:</b> from 10€ to 20€/month. Bike rental: from 10€ to 15€/month
<b>Housing</b>	<b>University residence (CROUS):</b> from 200€-500€/month <b>Private residence:</b> from 450€-850€/month
<b>Health</b>	from 6€-40€/month for health insurance and complementary coverage
<b>Civil liability Insurance</b>	from 16€-35€/year
